## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK:

For our final newsletter this year, I've decided to share an excerpt from the message I gave at the grade 8 graduation banquet. As you read this message, take some time to consider the questions I pose.

The verse for this year's graduating class is from Matthew 5:16, which says: "*In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.*"

In his Sermon on the Mount teaching, Jesus spoke this verse to his disciples. Jesus loved to teach using images and stories. The image of light is first used in the Book of Matthew to describe Jesus as the light of the world who has come into the darkness. In this passage, Jesus is transferring this image of light to his disciples, encouraging them to share and spread His light to everyone around them.



### To understand what it means to let your light shine, consider the purpose of light.

### LIGHT BRIGHTENS

Light can brighten a dull place. The absence of light is complete darkness. When people are discouraged, anxious, or disheartened, life can feel pretty dark. As Christians, our light can bring HOPE to a dark situation. We know that darkness does not have the final word because Jesus came to bring hope and light to the world.

- Is a place more hopeful when you are there?
- Do your words lift up and encourage or discourage the people you are around?



### LIGHT WARMS

When people are cold they are drawn to light for its warmth. God's light warms us up because it is full of His love. God has an all-consuming, never-ending love for all of his creation.

- When people are around you do they feel LOVED?
- Do your words and actions remind them of God's incredible love for them?
- Do you show compassion and love towards all people, even those different from you?





### LIGHT REVEALS

When people are looking for something, one of the first things they will do is reach for a light. God's light reveals the TRUTH—the truth of who He is and who He says we are.

- Do you speak the truth?
- Do people around you know that they can trust you?
- Do your contributions to a discussion move people toward all that is good, true, and holy?

This verse says that when we shine our light of Hope, Love, and Truth through our good deeds, people will glorify God in heaven.

### • Do your actions bring Glory to God?

#### • Do your actions point others to God?

I hope that each of you will continue looking for opportunities to be God's light to the world. Choose to let the good that is in each of you be spread and shared instead of the not-so-good. By doing this, you will bring glory to God.

I encourage you to take this verse to heart and remember to let your light shine because when you do, your light will bring:

- HOPE to those who are discouraged
- LOVE to those who feel lost and alone
- **TRUTH** to those who are uncertain
